- 3. All Exhibits must be staged on the Show Field by 10 a.m. on the morning of the Show, and must be re-claimed between 4.00 p.m. and 4.30 p.m.
- 4. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR. EXCEPT CLASS 97
- 5. NO EXHIBIT ALLOWED WHICH HAS PREVIOUSLY WON A PRIZE AT KESWICK AGRICULTURAL SHOW.
- 6. More than one entry per person in any one class, only one prize allowed.
- 7. The Judges shall have power of withholding prizes in every case where there shall not appear sufficient merit.
- 8. The Judges Decision is Final. No correspondence entered into.
- 9. Every care will be taken to safeguard exhibits, but the Society undertakes no liability. Entries are only accepted on this condition.
