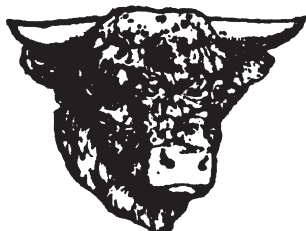

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. That the Society be named the Keswick Agricultural Society Ltd That its object be to encourage improvements in the Breed of Stock, the Management of Land, and in the general promotion of agriculture; and that the Show be open, except where otherwise stated.
2. That the Society consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and Committee of Management, with power to add to their number, three to form a quorum, and that the Secretary and Treasurer be considered ex-officio members of the Committee, who are to make all regulations for the government of the Society.
3. The dissolution of the Society shall be effected only by a two-thirds majority at a Special General meeting called for the purpose. The net assets remaining after the discharge of all debts and liabilities shall not be distributed among the members but shall be given to such charitable organisation or organisations or applied to such charitable purpose or purposes as the Special General Meeting shall by a simple majority determine.
4. Members of the Society shall have free admission to the Annual Agricultural Show and shall pay an entry fee of £4.00 for each entry except where otherwise stated. All entrance money shall be paid at the time of entry and no entry shall be accepted unless such money be paid.
5. Exhibitors and competitors are required to give notice, in writing, to the Secretary, on the Society's forms, on or before 8th August, describing the animals they intend to exhibit for different Classes, and stating their exact age. In all instances when this regulation is not strictly complied with, such animals will not be allowed to compete.
6. That every animal obtaining a prize shall have been bonafide the property of the exhibitor for three months prior to the Show.
7. That all animals shown as yearlings shall be allowed as such if under two years of age on Show day. The same shall apply to all two year and three year old animals.
8. No exhibitor or competitor shall enter any animal unless it comes strictly under the Rules of the Society; and in the event of any dispute the burden of proof will lie with the person concerned and until such proof is furnished, the Committee will not pay the prize.
9. That any exhibitor or competitor detected in an attempt to impose on the Society shall forfeit the class and shall not be allowed to compete for any Class in the following year. No excuse will be entertained.
10. That the Committee shall appoint one or more competent and dis-interested people to determine upon the merits of different exhibits brought into competition, who are to decide according to the best of their judgement. That all disputes which may arise shall be settled by the Committee.
11. That the Judges shall have power to withhold prizes in every case where there shall not appear sufficient merit, and of giving a prize in any case where there appears to be a great merit, although there be only one candidate.
12. All animals for exhibition must be on the ground before 8.00 a.m. Driving Horses must be on the ground not later than 9.00 a.m. At approximately 2.30 p.m. there will be a Grand parade, in which all prize winners must join.
13. Prize Money for Brood Mares to be kept in the hands of the Secretary until he has proof that the animals have complied with the rules under which they are exhibited. No stock to leave the ground before 2.30 p.m. without the written permission of the Secretary.
14. If only one exhibitor or competitor enters for any of the prizes, in all such cases no prize will be awarded, unless the Judges of the day deem it advisable to award the prize.
15. The Committee reserves the right to cancel a Class or Classes where there are insufficient entries for Judging. Participating entrants would be notified before the date of the show and entrance fees will be refunded accordingly.
16. In order to discourage frivolous protests, every protest must be made in writing, and sent to the Secretary, within seven clear days after date of Show and be accompanied by a deposit of £30.00. This deposit to be refunded should the protest be sustained.
17. All disputes to be settled by the Committee, whose decisions shall be final and without appeal.
18. Exhibitors and competitors please collect all their numbers at the relevant Secretary's Office before 9.00a.m. on the morning of the Show. Equine to be collected from Equine Secretary tent in horse box area.

19. As the object of the Society in giving prizes is to promote improvement in breeding stock, the Judges on making their awards, are instructed not to take into consideration the present value to the butcher of animals exhibited, but to decide according to the relative merits for the purpose of breeding. In the Horse Classes, the Judges, in awarding the prizes, are instructed, in addition to symmetry, to take activity and strength into consideration.
20. Admission to the Show field - £10.00; Senior Citizens £5.00; Children 6 to 16 yrs. £2.00. 5 and under free. Family Ticket £20.00 (2 adults & 2 children).
21. In the event of the show being cancelled, entry fees of £10.50 may be refunded at the discretion of the committee.
22. We respectfully point out that we advise exhibitors to insure their own stock against Public Liability.
23. Photos will be taken on the day which may be used for publicity, if you do not wish to be photographed, please inform the organiser.
24. Notices regarding current Health & Safety regulations must be observed at all times.
25. A portion of the Ground will be set apart for Trade Stands and charged according to the space of ground occupied. This also applies to the Art & Craft Tent and Food Marquee.
26. These Rules and Regulations will be strictly adhered to.

Equine Influenza

We recommend that all horses and ponies should be vaccinated against Equine influenza to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21-92 days later), followed by the first booster (150-215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times.

PASSPORTS MUST BE BROUGHT AS SPOT CHECKS MAY BE CARRIED OUT.

REGISTERED FELS (not to exceed 14hh)

1. Best Brood Mare with foal at foot
2. Best Foal
3. Best Gelding or Mare 4 years and over not entered in any previous class.
4. Best Yearling Filly, Colt or Gelding
5. Best Two or Three- year- old Filly, Colt or Gelding
6. Best Mare or Gelding to be brought into the ring mounted, Four years old and over, 50% for manners, ride and presentation in the ring. 50% for conformation and breed characteristics.

REGISTERED MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND IN-HAND

9. Best Two or Three- year old Filly, Colt or Gelding
10. Best Mare or Gelding Four years old and over not entered in any previous class.

REGISTERED MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN

11. Heritage Open Ridden class (Small M&M), Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland or Welsh A & B, 4 years old and over, Stallion, Mare or Gelding.
12. Heritage Open Ridden class (Large M&M) Dales, Fells, Connemara, New Forest, Highland, and Welsh C&D, Four Years old and over, Stallion, Mare and Gelding.
13. Heritage M&M Leading Rein Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest and Welsh A & B, 4 years old and over, Mare or Gelding, not exceeding 122cms, Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a snaffle bit.
14. Heritage M&M First Ridden. Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest or Welsh A & B, 4 years old and over, Mare or Gelding not to exceed 128 cm. suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a Snaffle Bit.

HEAVY HORSES

15. Best Mare with Foal at Foot.
16. Best Yearling, Filly, Colt or Gelding
17. Best Two- or Three-year-old filly, Colt or Gelding
18. Best Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over.
19. Young Handler class, Handlers aged 12-18.
20. Best Heavy Horse brought into the ring mounted (including part bred Heavy Horses). Kindly sponsored by Ravenstone Lodge Coach House & Restaurant.
21. Best Decorated Horse, any age Kindly sponsored by Ravenstone Lodge Coach House & Restaurant.

REGISTERED SHETLAND (Not to exceed 42 inches)

1. Classes must be confined to registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the society or those eligible for registration, (i.e. foals).
2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the show. All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.
3. There must be no colts or entire males in young handler classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in the in-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in the ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in in-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. 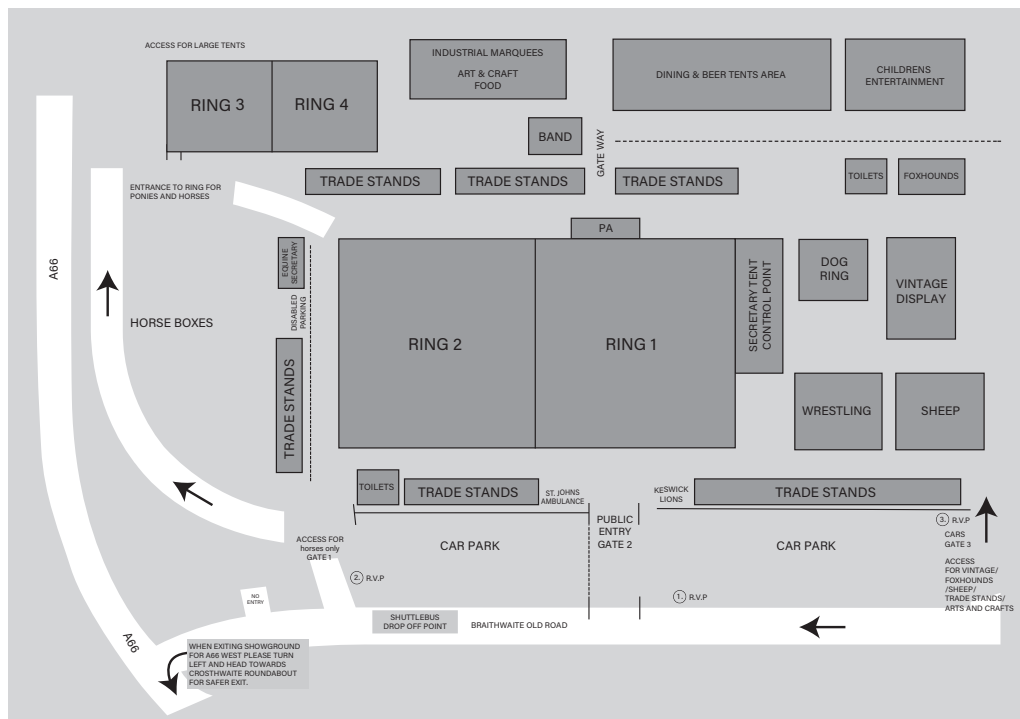
